2.6.1 PROGRAM OUTCOMES, PROGRAM SPECIFIC OUTCOMES AND COURSE OUTCOMES

The College priorities in the holistic development of student-teachers and harnesses all available resources towards the achievement of its goal. All academic programmes and co-curricular activities reflect the institution's mission to empower young women student-teachers to go out and teach the student community.

B.Ed (Bachelor of Education) – Programme

The 2 year B.Ed. Programme is comprised of three broad inter-related curricular areas namely (I) perspectives in Education (II) Curriculum and Pedagogic studies and (III) Engagement with the Field. All the courses include in-built field based units of study and projects along with theoretical inputs from an inter disciplinary perspective. Engagement with the Field is the curricular component that is meant to holistically link all the courses across the programme and it includes special courses for Enhancing Professional Capacities (EPC) of the student-teachers. Transaction of the courses is done using a variety of approaches such as case studies, group presentations, projects and discussions on reflective journals along with observations of children and interactions with the community in multiple socio-cultural environments.

M.Ed. (Master of Education) Programme

The 2 year M.Ed. Programme is comprised of five broad inter-related curricular courses namely (i) Perspective Courses (ii) Tool Courses (iii) Teacher Education Courses (iv) Specialisation: Core Courses (v) Specialisation: Thematic Courses. The M.Ed. Programme has inbuilt field-based units of study and practicum work tailored to suit the requirements of prospective teacher-educators. Dissemination of inputs in this programme is carried out by employing a variety of approaches, such as expository writing, academic writing, group presentations, discussions, selfdevelopment activities and field visits.
