#### PASSING MINIMUM FOR WRITTEN EXAMINATION

Each candidate who appears for the written examination in the first attempt shall be declared to have passed the Written Examination only if he or she secures not less than 50% in aggregate in each course with a minimum of 45% in the external examination in each full course and half a course. All other candidates shall be deemed to have failed in the Written Examination. A candidate who fails in one or more courses in the Written Examination shallbe permitted to appear again only for those courses in which he/she failed.

#### **REAPPEARANCE FOR WRITTEN EXAMINATION**

Each unsuccessful candidate shall be permitted to reappear for the written examinations within the next three consecutive academic years.

#### **PRACTICAL EXAMINATION**

Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University will conduct practical

examination after the successful completion of 16 weeks of school internship in the second year. Practical examination shall be normally conducted three months prior to the commencement of written examination.
